Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Nau mai, Haere mai! Hello, As-salām 'alaykum, Namaste, Nǐ hǎo, Chào bạn, Musta, Noa'ia, Hola, Mauri, Ni sa bula vinaka, Fakaalofa lahi atu, Mālō e lelei, Mālō nī, Talofa lava, and Kia orana, Greetings.

SCHOOL VALUES: Respect, Resilience, Integrity, Opportunity and Community are our school values. Integrity is our value for the rest of this week and week 1 in Term 2. Integrity is a character value. Hopefully, we are instilling in a person and in the tamariki, a feeling of knowing what is the right and honest thing to do. When we are pressured to do something we know is wrong, this is when our integrity is being tested. A brave person can pass the test by doing what they know is right. When we see this we can be filled with admiration and respect for the person and their integrity.

PARKING & OUR NEIGHBOURS: We would like to continue saying thank you to the majority of our parents who are doing a great job of respecting others, in showing integrity and in helping us keep all tamariki safe before and after school when parking. We have had a parent park over driveways and we would like to ask that they please follow the example of other parents and by keeping tamariki safe and in respecting and caring for our school neighbours.

<u>MIHI WHAKATAU:</u> This morning we had our school Mihi Whakatau for our new tamariki and their whānau. This was a slightly different Mihi as we took the time to also celebrate the learning that is happening in our new Kauri Block. Our celebration included our Choir, Pasifika Group, Indian Group and Kapa Haka. Our House Captains were our hosts and they included a story about Tane Mahuta and the mighty kauri. We welcome all new tamariki, whānau and staff members to our school. We look forward to learning and growing together in Term 2.

HOLIDAY BREAK: This is our last week of Term 1. It has been a good start to the year and our students will be looking forward to a break from school. Term 2 will commence on Monday 29th April. We hope you are able to enjoy some quality time with your children during the holiday break. We look forward to returning to school and continuing with the delivery of learning as 'together we educate and nurture the whole child'.

<u>ANZAC</u>: When we return to school we will hold a special ANZAC ceremony on Thursday 2nd May in week 1. This is a sombre, reflective time for our Nation and our tamariki. We use the opportunity to help educate the children as they learn about life being precious and the importance of living peacefully with others. 'Lest We Forget'.

TOPIC STUDY TERM 2: Each term the teams prepare and plan for the upcoming terms learning. Our teams discuss and decide upon a theme that will help guide the learning sequences for our literacy and topic time. The theme also becomes a context for maths when appropriate. In Term 2 the following topic themes are:

<u>Junior School Theme</u>: The Living World, students will be learning about different animal habitats, and how animals have adapted to their environments. The topic will include a visit to the zoo.

<u>Middle School Theme</u>: "Up high, down low and everything in between" This will be a focus on science, and in particular space and water. Elements of Te Ao Māori will be integrated throughout the learning.

<u>Senior School Theme</u>: "All creatures great and small." This will be a science theme similar to the Juniors, with more focus on types of animals and the categories of species.

END OF DAY ROUTINES: Parents could we please do a check in with your tamariki before we return to school next term around where they are being picked up and, or, whether they are walking home. This will help tamariki remember the plan for the end of the day. Children should not walk home and play at a friend's house on the way home. They should go directly to their waiting areas, or home. We will discuss this with the tamariki as well, so we are helping ensure everyone knows the plan and we keep everyone safe. If a child is unsure, they should always check in with their teacher and, or, the office. We are always happy to ring and clarify with home.
